





What is Title I





Title I is the largest federal education K-12 funding program that provides additional academic support and learning opportunities for students at schools with high percentages of socioeconomically disadvantaged children. The program is intended to help ensure that all students meet state and national academic standards.



Goals of Title I

- Increase academic achievement.
- Provide direct instructional support to students.
- Provide professional development for teachers.
- Promote parent education and involvement.





All Students Benefit

Our Title I program provides funding to schools that have 40% or more of its enrolled students who are considered to be from low income families by qualifying for free or reduced lunch.

Schoolwide Title I programs use all allocated funds to increase the amount and quality of learning time for all students.


Funds must supplement, not supplant, district funds.

The Longwood Central School District provides a well-balanced and comprehensive curriculum for students.



Measuring Progress



Students are expected to meet proficiency levels for the grade and or course they are enrolled in. Student progress is measured by several assessment methods.

- iReady, IXL, Go Math, NYSED Assessments, teacher-created assessments, student work.
- Regents' exams are administered for students enrolled in Regents level courses.
- Teacher-designed assessments are also part of the total picture of a student's academic progress.
- Report cards are distributed
 - K-4 Trimester
 - 5-12 Quarterly
- Interim reports are sent home in the middle of each marking period.




Parent Involvement


- One percent of a school's total Title I budget is for parent involvement activities.

The Title I Parent Involvement Policy






Parent Rights

- Have the right to know the qualifications of your child's teachers




What have we done with this year's title funds?




- Professional Development - Instructional Coaches support teachers in the area of literacy and mathematics
